- * Medical camps were setup at 13 different localities in Muzaffargarh & a record number of 7,944 patients treated.

Two young officers of Balochistan Laminates accompanied by Mr. Gulsher Khan went to Hyderabad on 24 September, 2010 to conduct an on ground survey of the damage done by the floods and what rehab efforts are required. The team visited 3 settlements in the vicinity of Habib Farms and the fourth was still inaccessible due to flood waters. Water has receded from many settlements and the inhabitants have started re-construction activities of their villages and homes on self-help basis.

One can see lot of devastation in the area because most houses were not made of concrete and were washed away. Water levels rose to approx. 6 feet in some areas during high floods resulting in complete displacement of people to higher plains.

During the visit to Hyderabad, the team distributed 250 family food packs, 200 water purification kits and medicines for 200 patients. The survey conducted showed that 50 houses in the area were completely destroyed or damaged beyond repair and need to be re-constructed.

Update from Punjab...

Medical camps were arranged in 13 different localities (bastis) between 15 & 28 September, 2010 and they attended to 7944 patients i.e. an average of 611 patients per locality. The medical camps will continue to provide medical treatment to the affected people of the area.

Ration packs were distributed to 164 families. Life Staws (The Swedish water purification devices) were also distributed to 121 families after training them on how it works. 800 water purification sachets were also distributed to the affectees.
